1. Preparatory	Prep A and C 2015 (primary only)	20m x 60m arena
2. Preliminary Primary	1.2 and 1.3 (primary only)	20m x 60m arena
3. Preliminary Intermediate	1.2 and 1.3 (secondary yr 7 to 9)	20m x 60m arena
3. Preliminary Senior	1.2 and 1.3 (secondary yr 10 to 12)	20m x 60m arena
4. Novice Primary	2.2 and 2.3 (primary only)	20m x 60m arena
5. Novice Intermediate	2.2 and 2.3 (secondary yr 7 to 9)	20m x 60m arena
6. Novice Senior	2.2 and 2.3 (secondary yr 10 to 12)	20m x 60m arena
7. Elementary	3.2 and 3.3	20m x 60m arena
8. Medium	4.2 and 4.3	20m x 60m arena
9. Advanced	5.2 and 5.3	20m x 60m arena

The Northern District Interschool Series 2017 (NDIS)

Individual Champion and Reserve Champion for each section will be awarded at the conclusion of the Northern District Interschool Series (NDIS). All Scores count towards the final NDIS Individual Championships. In case of an equal, sashes will be awarded to both parties. If a horse & rider combination has won the NDIS Championship at a particular level, they are not eligible for the NDIS Championship at that level in subsequent years. The exception to this is if they are at the highest level on offer, ie. Stars Level in Show jumping & Advanced Dressage. Riders can compete at same level but will not be eligible for NDIS points.

The School Team Champion and Reserve Champion for both Dressage and Showjumping will be awarded a Perpetual Shield/Rosette at the conclusion of the final event of the NDIS Championships.

Scoring individual champions:

In each class, 1st placed horses are allocated 30 points, 2nd 29 points, 3rd 28 points and so on to the last-placed horse.

The aggregate score over the two classes determines the placings.

In the event of a tie, the higher placing is awarded to the combination with the highest aggregate percentage over the two tests. In the event of a further tie, the higher placing is the combination with the higher percentage score in the more advanced test

The final countback methodology in the event of a further tie is the sum of the four collective marks from both tests.

In the event of equal placings in a test, no half/split marks are allocated. The equal placings receive the same points, then the next placing and points are skipped. i.e., 2 riders finishing equal 4th receive 27 points, with the next placing being 6th receiving 25 points

Scoring champion school

The top four riders' points from each school will be totaled to determine the winning school at the Braemar dressage championships.



Rules of Competition

This competition is affiliated with EA. EA members must put EA numbers on entry form.

Unless your school will cover your Accident and Public Liability Insurance you must be an EA or PCAV member.

If your school does cover these insurances, a letter of proof **MUST** be submitted with the Entry Form

ELIGIBILITY

Competition open to all currently enrolled primary and secondary school students.

CONDITIONS

- **Stallions and Rigs** are not permitted at this at this event
- VEIS and EA Rules apply; these can be found at www.veis.com.au www.equestrian.org.au , www.efavic.com.au.
- Schools must nominate a suitably experienced Team Manager. Team Managers are responsible for Gear Checks; inappropriate gear will result in elimination.
- All riders must be currently enrolled at the school they are representing and **MUST** be accompanied by an adult
- All riders must wear currently approved helmets and boots whilst mounted. School equestrian uniform including white, beige fawn or banana jodhpurs must be worn in all competitions and for presentations. **NO BLAZERS/TAILORED JACKETS.**
- Gloves must be worn in Dressage.
- No riders other than those competing are allowed to ride on the grounds.
- One horse, one rider rule applies. Riders may ride more than one horse.
- **LATE ENTRIES** will pay additional \$10.00 per entry.
- Events may run later or earlier than advertised riders are expected to be aware of changes to times and report accordingly. Riders who do not report in time to ride in their draw order may be eliminated.
- In the event of excessive entries, participation in the event will be based on order of receipt of entry excluding the riders of the school holding the competition.
- **SCRATCHINGS** after the Close of Entries. As per EA rules, a vet/doctor certificate is required for return of entry money less \$15.00 administration costs. The Event Secretary must be notified before the start of the class to receive a refund. For scratchings on the day call/SMS 0419 275 299
- Riders are encouraged to enter levels most suited to their level of riding competency and their horse's ability.
- In disciplines where grading or qualification applies, the EA rules for eligibility must be adhered to; e.g., dressage grading for horses.
- All appeals must be lodged by the Team Manager on the official form available from the organising committee, no later than 30 minutes after the incident accompanied by \$ 50.00, which will only be refunded if the protest is upheld. All appeals will be considered by the Jury of Appeal on the day.
- Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place in each class. Rosettes for overall Champion and Reserve for each section.
- All riders must provide their own saddle cloth or bridle numbers as per draw.
- The Committee reserves the right to alter, delete any event, and refuse entry with or without a reason.
